

Results from 181 respondents to the 2023 professional survey






Publications – SOSIDO

KRA 1: Advocacy and Representation

Primary Objective: Ensure that medical physics is widely recognized as an integral component of research, innovation and technology in health care

Secondary Objective: To be the recognized national voice of the medical physics profession and of safe, high quality medical physics practice in Canada

- 1. Endorsed CAR position statement on workstation standards in mammography accreditation and continue to collaborate with them on accreditation initiatives
- 2. Worked with partners to advocate for the federal government to prioritize funding and support for research and recruitment/retention of highly qualified personnel



KRA 2: Networking and Member Engagement

Primary Objective: To establish a highly effective national network through which the entire Canadian medical physics community can communicate and interact

Secondary Objective: To achieve and maintain a high level of member engagement

- 1. Struck a task force with CCPM to develop a complaints resolution process for the Code of Ethics
- 2. Saw increased participation in virtual programming including our Winter School
- 3. Launched a new Affiliate Membership program to increase engagement of our industry and organizational partners



KRA 3: Knowledge Acquisition and Dissemination

- **Primary Objective:** To ensure medical physicists everywhere in Canada can create and have access to relevant scientific and professional content.
- **Secondary Objective**: To ensure that appropriate member-created scientific content is available to all members
- 1. Members published 262 articles to peer-reviewed journals; COMP shared achievements through regular eBroadcasts.
- 2. Imaging Lecture Series with internationally renowned faculty speaking on fundamentals and cutting-edge technologies
- 3. Launched a Grant Writing Mentorship Program and MP-FIRE Research Partnerships initiative



KRA 4: Strategic Partnerships

Primary Objective: To leverage the capacity, and enhance the impact of, COMP through the building of strategic partnerships

Secondary Objective: To increase the profile and awareness of COMP through strategic partnering

- 1. Support aligned priorities with key partners such as CAP, CAR, CARO, CAMRT and CANO
- 2. Support international initiatives through participation in AAPM and IOMP activities
- 3. Enhance collaboration with CNSC through refreshed Innovation Grant



KRA 5: Governance and Administration

Primary Objective: To manage the programs and activities of COMP as effectively and efficiently as possible

- 1. Continued to enhance virtual programming
- 2. Refreshed COMP website to enhance access to key resources
- 3. Introduced online project/event request form to ensure a timely, consistent and transparent approach is taken to member requests for support







Notes on 2023 Budget

We have budgeted conservatively for 2023 with the large deficit observed in 2022. However, even with this, we are still expecting a small deficit.

Notables:

We are expecting a healthy revenue from our joint meeting with CARO.

We are also noting an increase in membership, which was declining during the early pandemic years.

Nomination and election process


- A call for nominations for the three vacancies was circulated to members via InterACTIONS and e-broadcast. It was also posted on the COMP website.


